*Welcome to our April Newsletter. It contains further details of our upcoming event, **Enchanted Isle – Ireland in picture song and story on 17th April** and gives you information on other events and items of interest which we are pleased to support. Enchanted Isle – Ireland in picture, song and story, is one of most ambitious productions ever undertaken by Irish Heritage and is on 17th April 2013 in St John's Smith Square, London SW1P 3HA. The original script has been devised and written by Irish Heritage Artistic Director and co-founder Ethna Kennedy with stage production by Moyna Cope.

The story of **Enchanted Isle** will be told by actor/storyteller John Cormack and in music by Fiona Murphy (soprano), Aaron Cawley (tenor), Ciara Moroney (piano) and Robert White (Uilleann Pipes). You can find more details of the performers on our website www.irishheritage.co.uk.

The story takes you on a journey through the counties of Ireland, North, South, East and West, with stories, readings and verse relating to the major cultural and scenic attractions and historical events and with music of the Uilleann pipes and piano and traditional and classical songs, including operatic arias. Pictures and scenes of Ireland will fit the story and show the beauty of the landscape and the context of the story.

This is the year of **The Gathering** a country-wide, year-long party in Ireland. **Enchanted Isle** will give you a taste of the beauty and cultural excellence of Ireland and encourage you and your friends to see for yourself and visit Ireland.

Its organ is considered one of the finest in Britain and of international importance. This is a huge honour but for one as young and talented as Hamish a really exciting challenge. On behalf of all the Friends of Irish Heritage I congratulate Hamish and look forward to hearing him perform with *Irish Heritage* again in the near future.
