Irish Heritage presents the latest in its *Young Musician Programme* on Tuesday 12th November 2013 at 7.30 pm in The Bolivar Hall, 54 Grafton Way, London W1T 5DL (Just off Tottenham Court Road: Nearest Tube Station: Warren Street see <https://www.google.co.uk/#q=bolivar+hall+london>)

It features **David Keating** (classical guitar) and **Eimear McGeown** (flute) and her folk band, in an exciting programme which combines classic, folk, Irish traditional, jazz and South American music performed by an outstanding group of musicians in a top class music venue, followed by a wine reception. An event not to be missed!!

David Keating is from Cork and is at present studying classical guitar at the Royal Northern College of Music in Manchester under Craig Ogden. David will play some traditional pieces for classical guitar – with a Spanish flavour - and in addition he will play jazz, reggae and South American music from his repertoire.

Eimear McGeown and her folk band, consisting of Eimear (Irish and classical flute), Colm McGonigal (harp/concertina), Tad Sargent (bouzouki/bodhran), Anna Jenkins (violin), Neil O'Loughlin (double bass), will perform a mixture of traditional Irish melodies, including "She Moved Through the Fair", and five original new compositions, including "Inis", the title track from her new Celtic Album.
