Enchanted Evenings has been written and devised by Ethna Kennedy. It will feature excerpts from some of the classical Irish Heritage productions over the past 40 years, with profiles of great Irish and Anglo-Irish literary and musical figures, such as Oliver Goldsmith (the subject of the first ever Irish Heritage event on 4th April 1974), Thomas Moore, W.B. Yeats, James Joyce, Oliver St John Gogarty, John Count McCormack, Oscar Wilde, Patrick Kavanagh and Percy French – combined with a touch of opera and some great Irish songs and stories.
