*It is with deep regret that we advise you of the death of our Co-Founder and Artistic Director, Ethna Kennedy. Ethna died peacefully at her home in Manchester on Saturday 3rd May. Her last contribution to Irish Heritage was devising and scripting, **Enchanted Evenings – 40 years of Irish Heritage** which was presented to a large and appreciative audience on Thursday 8th May in St George's Church Hanover Square and dedicated to her memory. Ethna was laid to rest with her husband Charles on Tuesday 13th May in Bridgemount, Co Mayo, following requiem mass in Knock. May she rest in peace.*

NEXT EVENT

Our **Summer Recital in Leighton House**, 12 Holland Park Road, London W14 8LZ, is on **Tuesday 3rd June at 7.30**. It features **The McDonagh Sisters**, Ailbhe (cello) and Orla (piano), in a programme including Beethoven (Sonata in A major, Op 69), Cassado (Requiebros), Debussy (Sonata), Popper (Hungarian Rhapsody Op.69) and a world premier by Irish based composer, Liam Bates, entitled: "Dancing with Gioconda - Andantino".

The McDonagh Sisters are an Irish cello and piano duo based in Dublin. They are both graduates of the Royal Irish Academy of Music ("RIAM") and furthered their music studies in the USA, with degrees from the Juilliard School of Music, New York, Eastman School of Music, Rochester NY and Indiana University School of Music. Following their return to Ireland, they released their debut album, "It's a Cello Thing" in 2012 which was named CD of the week on RTE Lyric FM and described as a "stunning debut album" by the *Irish Independent* and they followed with a sell-out concert in the National Concert Hall, Dublin. In addition to their active performance careers, The McDonagh Sisters are on the faculty of the RIAM in Dublin.

Una Hunt (piano) gave a wonderful recital/lecture on Irish Composers - their music and stories, on 12th February in Regent Hall London. It was recorded live by **British Music Radio** and is now available on www.britishmusicradio.net. It is, I assure you, a stunning recording.

Claudia Boyle (soprano), who appeared with *Irish Heritage* in April 2010, received a great write up in the *Irish Sunday Independent* in advance of her lead role as First Lady Pat Nixon in the opera by John Adams, **Nixon in China**, which opened in Dublin on 11th May (See

<http://www.independent.ie/entertainment/books-arts/unlikely-opera-star-whose-career-is-hitting-high-notes-30260729.html>) The Opera, and Claudia, got great reviews in Dublin but it also starred John Molloy, bass, (*Irish Heritage* April 2012) who, in the words of the critic, “brings an element of comedy to Secretary of State [Henry Kissinger](#)... as he enters a fantasy ballet sequence as the fictitious hooligan Lao Szu and does so with nimble vocal and physical acrobatics”. We always knew John has great stage presence, as well as a fine voice.
