The Ireland Fund of Great Britain Award 2017

We were pleased and honoured to receive *The Ireland Fund of Great Britain Award 2017* on Thursday 19th January 2017, presented by the IFGB Chairman, Garrett Hayes, at a reception in the Embassy of Ireland, hosted by the Ambassador, his Excellency Daniel Mulhall, and in the presence of the Minister for the Diaspora, Mr Joe McHugh TD.

The award acknowledged the contribution that Irish Heritage has made to the cultural life of Great Britain since our establishment in 1974 and the foresight of our founders, the late Ethna and Charles Kennedy, who identified the need for wider public recognition of the excellence of Ireland's musical and literary traditions and the contribution that young Irish musicians could make in furthering these aims. The Ambassador and Garrett Hayes both paid generous tributes to Irish Heritage and the award was graciously received by Joint Artistic Director, Katie Rowan, on behalf of the Board, and Friends of Irish Heritage.

Katie Rowan thanked the Ambassador and the Irish Government for their support through the Emigrant Support Scheme, and Garrett Hayes and the Board of the Ireland Fund of Great Britain for granting us this award. Katie highlighted some recent developments of Irish Heritage, in particular the Irish Heritage Music Bursary and its extension into additional music colleges; our partnerships with the RDS and with the Irish Traditional Music Archives (ITMA) in Dublin, which will enable us to bring a major event on the story of Traditional Music – the Goodman Collection - to a London audience in October 2017. Katie acknowledged that we are justly proud of the support given by Irish Heritage to many young musicians and Irish composers who have benefitted from the platform we provide in advancing their careers in Britain and represent in Britain the finest quality of our culture and traditions.

To illustrate the point, Jean Kelly, Joint Artistic Director, introduced the 2016 winner of the Irish Heritage Music Bursary, Christopher Quaid, violin, who played his unique arrangement of *The Minstrel Boy* to a rapt audience at the Embassy.

Again, our thanks to The Ireland Fund of Great Britain for this most prestigious award and to the Ambassador and his staff at the Embassy for the wonderful reception and kind words.

"A Night at the Opera" at the Princess Alexandra Hall of the Royal Over-Seas League, St James's, SW1A 1LR on **Wednesday 15th February at 7.30 pm** will feature the winner of the Royal Dublin Society (RDS) 2016 Music Bursary, **Aoife Gibney, soprano**, with **Killian Farrell, piano**, and special guest, **Carolyn Holt, mezzo-soprano**.

Aoife Gibney is the 2016 recipient of the €15,000 RDS Music Bursary. She is now continuing her vocal studies, a Masters in Opera, under Hedwig Fassbender at the Hochschule Fur Musik Und Theater in Frankfurt.

Killian Farrell, répétiteur and conductor, is currently on the 2016/17 Young Artist Programme at the National Opera Studio, London.

Aoife and Killian will be joined by special guest, **Carolyn Holt** – mezzo-soprano, winner of the inaugural Irish Heritage Bursary in 2015.

Aoife's delightful programme will feature, Lieder, a wide variety of opera arias, including operas by Mozart, Puccini, Massenet, Offenbach and Gounod, and songs from other great composers including, Delibes and Rachmaninov. This is a real treat for all music lovers.

We will be delighted to welcome on the night the **President of the RDS, Bernie Brennan**, and other RDS guests from Dublin, together with a significant number of their UK members.
